- Explore spiritual practices that nurture our work for personal and societal transformation.



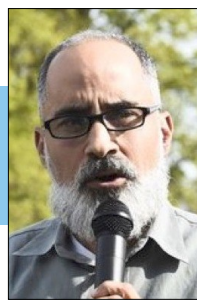

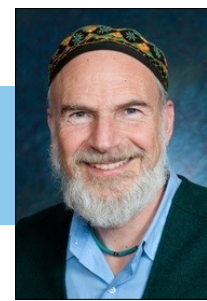
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
